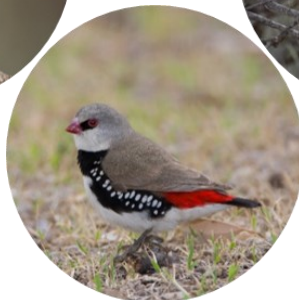
Participants will gain great insight into the birds of the area and you'll leave knowing how to record observations that can contribute to the overall SOS project's monitoring.
